<p><i>At St. Laurence Junior Academy, art and design is an important part of our creative curriculum as it provides our children with the opportunities to develop their imagination and allows them to express their individual interests, thoughts and ideas.</i></p> <p><i>Our high-quality art and design curriculum engages, inspires and challenges pupils, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design.</i></p> <p><i>Children will know how art and design both reflect and shape our history, and contribute to the culture, creativity and wealth of, not only our nation, but all over the world.</i></p>	<p><i>Art and design lessons are planned alongside the national curriculum. By the end of Key Stage 2, children are taught to develop their techniques, including their control and use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.</i></p> <p><i>They create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas. They also improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]</i></p> <p><i>They also learn about great artists, architects and designers in history from all over the world.</i></p> <p><i>We have strong links with other schools as we are part of the Thanet BRESIC collaboration. We meet three times a year to share best practice and also discuss any projects we may collaborate in.</i></p> <p><i>We are also part of the STEAM network which means we are involved with many local companies/organisations including Dreamland and the Turner Centre. The STEAM network provide the children with new experiences and opportunities to see art and explore through art.</i></p> <p><i>Our staff plan many curriculum weeks throughout the year, one being an art-themed week. The children have the opportunity for collaborative working with other year groups and explore the different styles and techniques of a range of artists from different cultures.</i></p>	<p><i>The intent of our creative art and design curriculum is that children will feel like artists and create work that they are proud of.</i></p> <p><i>Our classroom displays will reflect the children's sense of pride in their artwork and the children will have positive attitudes when talking about art.</i></p> <p><i>Our school will celebrate children's achievements in art and will show the subject's high status in our school, particularly with our Artsmark award. We will demonstrate our art in our outdoor as well as indoor environment.</i></p> <p><i>Children will be assessed three times a year using Target Tracker statements. This data is then used to track progress and attainment for each child and groups of children. It is also used to inform future planning.</i></p> <p><i>Pupil consultations on our art and design curriculum take place annually. Children's opinions are valued and noted to see how we can develop our curriculum and implement any of their ideas.</i></p>
